This is a particularly unique time of year in that we say goodbye to the closing year, putting away for storage all the treasured memories we have made and letting go of mistakes and regrets so they do not hold us back. In the very next breath, it seems, we say hello and welcome to a bright and shiny new year that holds the promise of so much hope. That hope will turn into the conviction of New Year's resolutions like exercising more, and perhaps losing some weight. If we take ourselves and our relationship with God seriously, we will also look at resolutions to help the poor and needy more generously; to be better parents, children, friends and neighbours than we were last year, and to be more intentional in our walk with Jesus by recommitting to prayer, study and worship in deepening ways.

This unique time of the year lends itself to reflection, and while you contemplate your unfolding desires for the new year, I have been contemplating what it means to be a pastor. In our Lutheran tradition of "the priesthood of all believers" where God calls us all to be Christian ministers to each other, a pastor is called and set apart by a community to be theologically trained, studying the scriptures to more effectively preach the word, and to administer the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and declaring to you the "entire forgiveness of all your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit". We are also called to visit the sick and distressed and to bury the dead. But this calling to be a pastor is so much more than that. Along the way we develop relationships, you and I, and we become part of each others' lives. Getting to know you better through teaching confirmation classes, marriage counselling, helping people prepare for death, and being invited into your homes has been a profound blessing to me and I thank you for each of those experiences.

Some of the deepest joys of the work God has given me come from being part of relationships being healed and families being restored. It is humbling, and a particular spiritual treasure to be able to help someone choose to engage life instead of choosing to end it.

This work, like all of our work when we choose to love each other, is possible because of the gift of Christmas – Jesus the Christ born among us in human form. Christ in us means we give a face and hands to Christ, loving the world as God does.

Whatever this new year holds for each of us, may it be rewarding, fulfilling, spiritually deepening, and filled with the peace and love of God.
