SERMON- Pastor Sylvia Swiatoschik (Dean of Thames Valley Ministry Area) *Matthew16:18-19*

^{"18}And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it. ¹⁹I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

This is one of the all-time favourite and often used scriptures for church anniversaries. In Jesus' remark to Peter, "and upon this rock"... scholars have debated over who or what Jesus is referring to. Because the Greek term 'petras' (Peter) is defined as a little rock, it is widely held that Jesus was not referring to Peter, but to Himself as the rock and chief cornerstone of the church.

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone", further supports the idea that the foundation (Christ), upon which the church is built is permanent and indestructible.

God's church, will be an assembly founded on Jesus' identity as the Messiah of the living God. The church is the "ekklesia" or the assembly, or synagogue, or gathering. Jesus uses the words "my church," and we remember that the church belongs to Christ. The church does not belong to its members, its pastors, or its power groups. The church always belongs to Christ.

We also remember that Jesus was going to build his church, and that building process has been going on for centuries. Jesus was and is forever building this community of believers that belongs to him. Christ is forever building this congregation, Trinity Lutheran Church as well.

Jesus' asserts that "the gates of hell" would not prevail against the church. Jesus confidently declares the stability and security of this new community against all attacks, even from the forces of evil.

My friends, we live in a time where every other month a new poll comes out showing a decline in religious belief, a decline in church attendance, a decline in personal religious practice and so on. We hear often of church closures, downsizing and decline. We go to meetings and see the bills for maintaining the building and supporting a Minister's salary are always increasing. At the same time, reading the treasurer's report of the decline of donations or giving.

As of now you have filled out your congregational profile and begun the divine wait of connecting with a Pastor searching for a call. It is easy to become discouraged, but Trinity has faced this process of waiting many times in its history. It faced economic upset in the depression era - I am sure the members wondered at that time, how they could support the church. Trinity faced the unknown when

it's sons were sent to war in World War II, the plaque outside the sanctuary names them all.

Trinity has endured heartache, upset, conflict and mourning. I remember with love and fondness Meta, Otto, Martin, Keith and Katie - just a few of the saints that are now with Jesus. I invite you all to take a moment to reflect on the saints of this congregation and name them in your hearts.....

But also, more importantly Trinity has worshipped, rejoiced, served and celebrated together as well. A century of relationships and all of life's experiences shared. This is why we treasure and honour the 100th anniversary of Trinity.

One of the biggest challenges today is not just confusing the church for the building, but rather confusing the church with the institution. So much of the church's energy these days is directed into institutional survival. It's a normal response; nobody wants it to fold on our watch. But what we are witnessing is the folding of the institution. None of that is the church.

The gospel text today reminds us, that the true source of life and strength of the church is Jesus Christ, the son of the living God. It is in Jesus that we find our strength, our unity and, most importantly, our future.

The church does not belong to its members or its pastor its. The church always belongs to Christ.

We also remember that Jesus was going to build his church, and that building process has been going on for centuries and will continue. Jesus was and is forever building this community of believers that belongs to him. Christ is forever building this congregation, Trinity Lutheran Church, as well.

With a century under your belts, with experience, courage and reliance on Jesus Christ, you will face with faith, the future for that which is to come. **Amen.**
