

inevitable, the possibilities suddenly become almost endless. In the past three months, we've shifted from the green hymnal to the cranberry book that was first introduced about 40 years ago.

Services, such as All Saints, were altered a bit in an effort to make them more meaningful for more people. New services, such as the Liturgical Year in Review for Christ the King, have been introduced. Communion is now offered weekly.

Plans for 2024 include the introduction of an occasional midweek service known as Messy Church and I hope, with council's blessings, to see our music program expand with the addition of high school and university music students, as well as some accomplished musicians.

As you can see, I have fully embraced the call to change and I invite you to do the same.

The people we touch through our ministry ... the hearts we quicken and open through worship ... the connections we make or re-establish ... all make for an exciting time at Trinity.

To be sure, Covid made it easy to despair for the future of the congregation and of the church in general.

It also caused people to think whistfully of the past ... when the pews were full ... when children came with their parents and grandparents ... when Sunday school was bursting at the seams and when the hymns were the ones that had been known since childhood. Covid made it easy to wish for a return to those times.

It's fine to remember the good ol' days, but they are just memories of what was ... not examples of what is ... or true hopes for what we can be.

This is why Matthew's verse is important (and I am admittedly taking it a bit out of context), Things from the past cannot be allowed to bind us to that past because they speak to a reality that no longer exists. If we loosen the bindings, then we are free - liberated is the word Paul likes to use.

We are free to worship and minister in different ways ... to reach out to new communities and organizations in the city ... and live and love as we are called.

Each Sunday morning gives us reason to loosen despair that may have bound hearts during recent times.

That is when we come together as a community ... as a faith family ... to worship, praise, and give thanks. It is also time when we can see change as new, younger faces arrive and people who have been disconnected from the congregation, whether through the pandemic or something more personal, return to see the changes they have heard about.

Sunday morning is when we feel hope more deeply. So, let us embrace change ... the future. Let us embrace hope.
