2024 - HIGHS NOTES AND VERY LOW ONES

It's usually this time of the year when people look back at the previous months, tally things up and decide if it was a good year.

Looking back at 2024, I think it's safe to say the year held a mixed bag for Trinity.

THE (VERY) BAD

It pains me to consider that the discovery of human feces in the sanctuary is what will mark our entire year together in faith. It was the subject of my first extended conversation with the synod's new bishop. It was an inauspicious introduction to Trinity for the Bishop Carla.

The full measure of a person's arrogance and entitlement that would lead someone to scoop something out of a toilet, bring it to the church and deposit it within the sanctuary is impossible to fathom.

Congregational Council has begun the work of making the building more secure and limiting after-hours access.

I am grateful to those who reached out and shared their disgust, sadness and anger over such a repulsive act. I am grateful that we were able to grieve together. However, I am troubled by the number who remain silent over this incident and over other divisive actions that some have undertaken during the past year.

I spoke to the congregation prior to worship on December 22.

In my short talk, I shared the pain I felt as the congregation I love was wounded by the desecration of its worship space. I questioned what pastor would want to minister to a congregation where a number of its members seem so accepting of such behaviour and of those who actually take part in efforts to undermine Congregational Council and divide the congregation.

I invited those in attendance to discuss the matter amongst themselves for a few minutes.

What was said during those minutes? Nothing ... the sanctuary was silent.

If a turd in the sanctuary doesn't merit outrage and discussion, what would?

Silence, then, is the problem.

Silence is taken as acceptance ... silence allows these actions to continue unchallenged. Ultimately, silence could kill Trinity. It seems that any talk comes when backs are turned

Unless members stand up and say "no," divisive personal ministries and reprehensible acts will continue to pull council's attention from essential areas and divert us from moving into a future that offers new life to Trinity and to those to whom we minister.

If we cannot advocate for Trinity within our walls and stand against those who would divide us by placing their egos before the congregation's well-being, then how can we effectively and authentically advocate and stand with others outside our walls?

If you profess to love Trinity - as a community of faith and not as a private club - then it has come time to stand up and help congregation leadership move Trinity forward and ensure that its future lies beyond the next couple of years. Silence can no longer be an option.

NOW... THE VERY GOOD

The full potential of our music program is being unlocked.

The leadership and connections that Val brings to the role of choir director and accompanist has been beyond belief. I joke that she works the choir like thoroughbreds - even when they run the scales, they sound fantastic. Best of all, new voices from the congregation have joined the choir - and more are expected to come aboard in 2025. As well, plans are being made to bring people from the community on to the choir.

Our guitarist, Esther, continues to help the congregation develop new musical chops. Esther is joining the Worship & Music committee, which grows to five members. Our latest addition, Brandon Lesperance, made his Trinity debut on Christmas Eve. Even though he was unfamiliar with the pipe organ, Brandon was fantastic during the early service. He will be a valued member of the music program as we move forward.

The variety of musical talents within the music program gives us the opportunity to create and offer a variety of worship experiences to the congregation and to the church-shoppers who give Trinity a try.

The Trinity Arts Series, the brainchild of Jim's and Mary's son-in-law, Florin Simioanca, holds so much potential for Trinity and its new Music Outreach Program.

The proceeds from the concerts will go toward the church and help fund music scholarships and instrument rentals for students (those are just two of the ideas that have been pitched thus far).

The concerts will also bring the community into the building and enhance our efforts to be a neighbourhood hub.

The next concert, featuring a performance by the Detroit Symphony's string quartet, is scheduled for April 12.

Moving the Clothing Giveaway to a monthly schedule has proven to be a good move.

The turnout each month has shown that the need is too great to make people wait six months between offerings. At the most recent Giveaway, a single mother of four was in tears of joy that she was able to get clothing for her children in time for Christmas. <u>We do great ministry</u>.

Our ministry with Street Help and the Welcome Centre continues to grow and strengthen. Our regular donations are met with thanks and tears. The need is great and our ministry is essential.

Best of all, new faces are coming to Trinity AND they are becoming involved in the life of the congregation. Where once things ran through one or two people, now a number of people have stepped forward to help guide the life of the congregation. They are a blessing to us all.

Council Updates:

Membership Update – Lane Peifer:

After much reflection, discernment and discussion over Lane's decision to refuse delivery of a letter calling for a meeting with the Church Council and the Pastor on December 11, 2024, to offer an explanation, contrition and an apology to this Church Council and members of this congregation for his divisive actions, Church Council has voted to move Lane's membership from active to responsibility status. The Synod will be notified and his non-Christian behaviour will be documented and will be on file at the Synod office.

Lane, will now be designated an inactive member. As a result, in accordance with our Constitution and with the knowledge of the <u>Bishop's</u> office, his membership is now in the responsibility status effective December 11, 2024.

The implications of this move, means that he:

- 1. cannot take part in or vote at Congregational meetings;
- 2. cannot serve on any congregational committees;
- cannot take part in any congregational activity;
- 4. cannot attend services or congregational functions at Trinity;
- 5. cannot represent Trinity in any means at external functions.

If after prayerful discernment Lane comes to a point where he believes he can offer sincere contrition and an apology, he can contact either the congregational council or the pastor to schedule a meeting.

*** Lane Peifer scheduled a "secret" Trinity Christmas event at the Legion on Saturday, December 21 – the same afternoon as the Academy Brass Quintet's performance. Lane did not even have the decency or respect to ask Congregational Council if he could have this event at Trinity. The off-site event held no benefit for Trinity or its future. ***

The Gloves Are Off:

Your Council is now tired of being the "nice guy" while members of this congregation bad mouth us, spread lies and now shit on us – literally. THIS MUST END!! A very emotional and troubled Pastor Chris spoke with his heart on Sunday, December 22, before the service started.
