## **OUR MINISTRY IS ESSENTIAL**

"Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' "

Matthew 25: 45

The latest copy of the *Anglican Journal* arrived at the office last week.

Usually, I put the copy of the publication out in the Narthex when it arrives in the mail, but this time I was waiting for the choir members to arrive for rehearsal (I'm the Thursday doorman) before going on with my day.

So, I glanced through the pages while I was waiting at the counter.

Two articles caught my attention. The first was about the financial challenges a number of Anglican congregations are facing. Like Lutheran congregations, the Anglicans are dealing with a drop in offerings and with the reduction in the number of available priests to minister congregations.

Just for comparison, our synod - which stretches from Halifax to Wawa currently has 15 open congregational calls due to retirements and departures.

While congregations face such challenges, the need for their ministries is increasing and will continue to increase as the world faces the realities created by the U.S. administration. We're feeling the effects in Canada and elsewhere in the world. It would be naive to believe otherwise.

In the other article, Canon Maggie Helwig, rector of St. Stephen-in-the-Fields Church in Toronto, said:

"We are already seeing a harder, meaner attitude here in Canada, too: things being blamed on immigrants, things being blamed on trans people, things being blamed on homeless people, on 'drug addicts.' Blame and targeting and othering."

I have heard the blame game being played in my travels in the city and even echos of it within the halls at Trinity. People seem to believe that the leadership change in the U.S. and the attempts at division by political leaders here in Canada gives them free reign to voice and practise bigotry and hatred. In those times, we need to remember Jesus' words in Matthew's gospel.

Weeks later, I remain haunted by the woman entering at the Downtown Mission after the Coldest Night event. Her eyes were a mixture of terror and desperation.

I cannot shake that look or of the look of brokeness of the man leaning against the wall behind her. In that same article, Helwig and Archbishop Anne Germond, acting primate of the Anglican Church of Canada, called on their members to continue to speak on behalf of marginalized and victimized persons.

They also argue that this atmosphere of uncertainty and displacement makes the work of churches more essential and in demand. Are we up to the challenge?

Those of us who have taken part in the midweek Holden services and meals have seen this at Trinity.

The number of persons joining us for soup and bread has increased each week. Some of them have benefited from our Monthly Clothing Giveaway. They, in turn, have spread the word about our ministries and the Trinity is a place where people back up their words with actions.

The numbers bear out the Anglican clergy's statement about the heightened demands being placed on churches. The numbers also have me wondering if the soup and bread meal should be a regular ministry at Trinity.

What is clear is that Trinity is needed, Trinity is making a difference in lives and Trinity needs the work and support of all to fully live into the gospel.

As we move forward into the uncertainty and anger of the world that has been sparked largely by the orangehaired one in the States and his supporters, congregations' advocacy and ministry becomes will be an essential part of peoples lives.

I hope that we all remember the words in Matthew and that we embrace the Gospel Imperative of feeding, comforting, loving and protecting the poor, the outcast and the stranger. I believe we are up to the challenge.
