It became clear at last spring's clothing giveaway that a great many people rely on Trinity's ministry to clothe themselves and their families.

The Fellowship Hall was packed, the foot traffic was constant and tables were regularly emptied over the course of the two-day event.

The need was so great that the congregational council decided to make some changes.

The twice-a-year schedule was amended so that the giveaway was offered on a monthly basis.

As well, the parlour, which was only used for an occasional meeting or funeral reception, was repurposed to accommodate the event. This also made access to the building less cumbersome to people with physical challenges.

The giveaways during the past few months have demonstrated that council made the right decision.

People line up at the front doors almost an hour before the giveaways begin. The attendance is constant and bags of clothes are going out the door to help families in need. People also pick up food from the shelter table – which underscores the needs of the community are going unmet.

Trinity is blessed with a solid roster of volunteers, BUT more are always welcome to join us in this clearly essential outreach (plus, the pastor brings pastry for the coffee breaks).

This is a note that I would like to pluck in this issue of the Trinitarian. I encourage anyone affiliated with Trinity, to offer an hour or two of your time just to experience this ministry. You will hear stories that underscore just how important Trinity is to the community – not just spiritually, but boots-on-theground service.

Allow me to share a couple of stories from the April giveaway.

A couple, who are in their 40s, arrived at the giveaway. was hobbling around the building. The woman is recovering from two broken ankles and er husband steadied her from time to time

and carried the bags of clothes they selected. As she sat in the Narthex to recover some strength and ease the pain in her legs, her husband shared that he is a shift worker who logs about 55 to 60 hours a week.

They live in a local motel because they can't afford permanent housing. The giveaway is a lifeline to them ... allowing them to use their funds for food or to save for more appropriate accommodations.

Another woman repeatedly called Trinity and its people "blessings" as she examined clothes on one of the racks. She had left an abusive relationship with just the clothes on her back and was staying on a friend's couch. She left with four bags of clothes ... thanking us all the way.

Such thanks and blessings were offered when the socks collected on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday were delivered to the Downtown Mission. They are also shared whenever we drop off food at Street Help or snack kits for the children at the Welcome Centre.

These stories show how important Trinity's efforts are to the community. It is an affirmation of our ministry and our call to redouble our ministry initiatives. Some of those who took part in our Lenten soup and bread meal had also taken advantage of the clothing giveaway. During one meal, a couple of visitors said that they rely on church meals to carry them through the week.

Congregational council is discussing making such meals a weekly event beginning in the fall (providing we can get financial assistance from the synod's charitable agency).

As I have said several times in the past, don't ever believe that what we do doesn't make a difference in people's lives. The effects of our ministry ripples outward from 1215 and we may never fully know the impact. If Trinity ceased to exist, it would be noticed.

So, please accept the invitation and become involved in Trinity's various outreach efforts ... help out at a clothing giveaway ... help promote our music outreach efforts and its concerts ... volunteer to work the Trinity table at PrideFest in August ... or bake something if the revised, revamped Christmas event intended to replace the Christmas Bazaar takes flight.

Trinity's outreach ministry is only effective if everyone is involved.

NEW TRADITION UNVEILED FOR THE DAY




